On leaving the Army in 1987 I joined HM Prison Service and served through to 2003 at Category A establishments.

From there to Kent Police and subsequently Stagecoach UK Bus from driver through to Operations Manager retiring at 66 in August 2021.

I fill my retirement time going to watch Harlequins Rugby club as a season ticket holder, Oval Invincibles Cricket, walking with Ramblers and cinema and the theatre.
